How to complete the challenge

The challenge pack is suitable for all sections. You can choose to complete activities on your own, as a Six, Patrol, unit, or another group of your choice.

Feel free to adapt the activities or use ideas of your own that help promote your unit and Girlguiding. We have listed some UMAs that might help you complete the challenge.

You don't have to do all the activities, but we would like you to do something from each of the sections – GROW, SHOUT and SHARE.

We suggest Rainbows and Brownies complete 2 activities in each section, and Guides and Rangers complete at least 3 – but you could do more!

You can choose how long you'd like to spend completing the challenge, you may like to pick one section per term or build a term programme around the challenge – that's up to you.

Staying Safe

If you are a Rainbow, Brownie, Guide, Ranger, or Young Leader you must tell your unit leader or another person you trust what you are planning to do, to make sure it is safe.

Never share your personal details like your name or address with strangers.

Get permission from your parent/carer before you go online or download anything.

If you are taking photos, you must ask that everyone in the picture has given their permission. Your leader will be able to help with this.

If anything worries you, tell someone you trust.



This is about learning more about Girlguiding, finding out about the other sections, and providing a warm welcome to new girls and volunteers.

GROW Activities

- Learn about Girlguiding and how we're structured. You could create a guiding family tree – can you add names to your tree?
- Research the history of Girlguiding and how old your unit is. You could try some traditional guiding activities and try on some old uniforms.
- Find out about WAGGGS. You could invite someone who has visited a Girlguiding world centre to visit your unit.
- Hold a joint event with other sections in your District or Division, so you can meet units from other sections.
- Create an invitation or information flyer about your unit and send it to the section below. Rainbows could give it to their friends.
- Find out more about what you can do next in Girlguiding. You could invite the leader or girls from the section above to visit. If you are old enough, you could find out about becoming a Peer Educator or a Young Leader.
- Learn about how to include everyone at your unit. Think about how you might need to adapt to welcome girls or volunteers with different needs.
- Create your unit's '10 top tips' for welcoming new girls or volunteers. You could try these out with new members or share your ideas with other units.

This is about advertising your unit and engaging with potential new members. Ask your County PR Adviser for help or advice.

SHOUT Activities

- Write an article or advertisement about your unit and send it to a local newspaper or newsletter.
- Produce a Facebook ad campaign or set up a social media account for your unit, District or Division (Online safety alert!)
- Create your own video of activities you enjoy doing at your unit and share it on social media (Online safety alert!)
- Design an eye-catching poster to display at your meeting place. You could find other places to display it too, try your local library, post office or shops.
- Produce a postcard and distribute it. You could have a competition to see who can post theirs the furthest.
- Contact your local radio station and tell them all about Girlguiding. You could see who can get a 'shout out' on air!
- Hold a 'bring a friend' evening or a 'meet and greet' event, so your friends can find out more about Girlguiding.
- Design and make your own 'merch' and use it outside of your unit. You could design your own tote bag and use it to go shopping.
- Talk to someone who doesn't know about Girlguiding and tell them what you love about it. You could do a 'show and tell' session at school.
- Hold a 'photo shoot' at a unit meeting or event. You could use these photos to promote your unit online or in the local newspaper. (Photo permissions alert!)

SHARE Activities

- Research your local community. What other community groups do you have? Who else uses your meeting place?
- Join in with a local community event. You could take part in a carnival or carol singing, attend a fete or fair, gala or parade.
- Do something to benefit your local community. You could hold a litter pick, help with the local food bank, plant flowers in a community space or visit a local care home.
- Carry out some random acts of kindness. You could make cards and send them to people who are lonely or vulnerable.
- Hold a fundraising event to support a local charity. You could visit or write to them to tell them about what you did.
- Invite local adults from other community groups to your meeting. Find out about what they do and show them what Girlguiding is all about.
- Write to your local MP, tell them about Girlguiding and ask them to visit your unit. You could do this to celebrate UK Parliament Week.
- Hold a 'bring a parent/guardian evening' or invite your parents and guardians to join you for tea and cake.
